



CUTLASS ACTIVITY SHEET TEACHERS' GUIDE

AIM OF ACTIVITY SHEET

To develop in students an interest in growing plants from seeds.

(A BASIC SHEET)

OBJECTIVES

After completing this activity sheet, students should be able to:

- carry out a long term activity.
- demonstrate the skills needed in growing plants from seeds.

MATERIALS REQUIRED

Instructions in the Activity Sheet have deliberately been kept brief to encourage students to try different growing techniques etc.

The following material should be available for students to use as they wish:

- Radish seed. (You can buy named varieties or packets of mixed radish seed.)
- Various fertilizers.
- Different soils and soil additives (eg compost, sand, peat, pumice, untreated sawdust).
- Plastic containers (eg yoghurt or margarine containers with drainage holes.

(These seeds are also stocked by some nurserymen.)

EXTENSION WORK SUGGESTIONS

- Make a poster advertising the competition.
- Grow other vegetable or flower seeds.

Any seedlings that students raise could be:

- taken home and grown by the student.
- grown in gardens at school.
- sold to teachers.
- Grow tall plants (eg climbing beans, sunflowers, etc). Keep a record of growth and plot a graph of height v time.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

- It would be best to use this Activity Sheet at the start of Term I or during Term III when conditions are most suitable for seed germination.
- Students could grow their radishes in containers or in gardens outside (at school or at home).
- An initial discussion on conditions needed for germination could be helpful or you could give students CUTLASS sheet BB-04: Growing Seeds, before this sheet.
- Set a time limit of 3 to 4 weeks for the competition. You could award prizes for the best radishes grown.
